






Marin County: Daily COVID-19 Cases






How many Marin residents have been vaccinated?








Marin County Residents: Daily Doses







COVID 19 Vaccine Allocation in Marin County

Marin Public Health Allocation

- •Week of 2/15
- Approximately 9,000 doses
- 6,000 second doses
 - Allocated to 1st dose provider
- •3,000 first doses

 - Mobile vaccination units


- Persons age 75 or older

Marin County: COVID-19 Mortality and Age

COVID-19 Mortality Rate



A vaccine given to someone age 75 and older is:

- **332 times** more likely to prevent a death than a vaccine given to someone age 0-49
- **34 times** more likely to prevent a death than a vaccine given to someone age 50-64
- 4 times more likely to prevent death than a vaccine given to someone age 65-74

COVID-19 Vaccine




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
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- 1/21/21: Marin Public Health and local health care partners are prioritizing people age 75 & alder as the next group for vaccination as part of Phose 18.
