MINUTES

1. Call to Order

Chair Rienks called the meeting to order at 5:32 pm.

2. Roll Call

Committee members present: Jennifer Rienks, PhD (Chair), Samantha Ramirez (Board Member); Kathy Taylor (Community Member)

Staff present: David Klein, MD, CEO; Jill Kinney (VP Marketing and Communications); Tricia Lee (EA)

3. Public Comment

There was no public comment.

4. Approval of the Agenda/Approve of Minutes

Agenda approval: Ms. Taylor moved to approve the agenda as presented. Director Ramirez seconded. **Vote: all ayes**

Minutes approval: Ms. Taylor moved to approve the minutes of the meeting of January 20, 2026
Director Ramirez seconded. **Vote: all ayes**

5. Results of Careers in Medicine Event

Ms. Kinney provided an overview of the 2026 Careers in Medicine event held on March 5, 2026. The event was sold out, with 64 students plus chaperones in attendance. Promotion was primarily handled through the school district.

Ms. Kinney reported that the event was well received, with 82% of survey respondents indicating the event exceeded expectations and 18% indicating it met expectations. Enhancements included adding additional time to the agenda, allowing students to select preferred tour groups, and improving overall flow.

The Committee discussed requesting data from the school district regarding student participation by school to better understand representation and potential opportunities for broader outreach. The Committee also discussed exploring possible physician shadowing opportunities at the practice level, subject to appropriate policies, permissions, and requirements.

The Committee discussed the possibility of holding a second Careers in Medicine event later in the year, potentially in November, and requested that related costs and staffing needs be reviewed.

6. Pop-Ups to Date Results

Ms. Kinney reviewed pop-up events completed to date, including the Dominican Health Fair on April 7, 2026, which had approximately 80 attendees and 40 screenings, and the Aging Well Expo at the Marin City Senior Center, which had approximately 40 attendees and 10 blood pressure screenings.

7. Pop-Ups Schedules for Remainder of 2026

Ms. Kinney reviewed planned and potential pop-up events for the remainder of 2026, including senior fair participation, library screening events, Heart and Student Health Day, fall prevention programming with Vivalon, infant CPR classes, and potential outreach through Food.org.

The Committee discussed developing informational materials for Food.org distribution, including healthcare access resources, low-cost or no-cost care options, mental health resources, MCC, RotaCare, and Operation Access. Staff will prepare draft materials for Committee review.

8. Seminars Scheduled for Remainder of 2026

Ms. Kinney reviewed proposed community seminar topics for the remainder of 2026.

The Committee discussed a potential Women's Cancer Symposium in conjunction with the Parasol family. Proposed topics included hormones and cancer risk, dense breasts, early detection, genetics, cancer and menopause, cancer in younger adults, and HPV-related cancers. A tentative date of October 21, 2026 was discussed, pending physician availability and confirmation.

The Committee discussed a proposed diabetes seminar, with potential dates of September 15 or 16, 2026. Proposed topics included advances in diabetes care, diabetes and heart disease, GLP-1 medications, technology exhibits, and related women's health considerations.

The Committee also discussed a potential Alzheimer's seminar. Suggested topics included clinical updates, early diagnosis, treatment options, caregiver support, and community resources. The Committee expressed interest in including community partners and resources for families caring for individuals with Alzheimer's disease.

9. District News Letter

The Committee discussed creating a District newsletter or e-blast. Suggested content included an explanation of the Marin Healthcare District and its relationship to MarinHealth, patient stories, primary care access, behavioral health, support for underserved populations, upcoming events, physician spotlights, and Board member features.

The Committee expressed interest in sending at least one or two newsletters before the election and then continuing on a quarterly basis. Staff will develop a sample template and proposed topics for review.

10. Website status

Ms. Kinney reviewed website traffic information based on server log data, noting that Google Analytics is not used due to HIPAA and privacy compliance concerns. She explained that the available data is directional and should not be considered precise.

The Committee discussed the importance of using the website and newsletters to better explain the District's role, the Hospital's role, and the relationship between the District Board and Hospital Board. The Committee also discussed exploring HIPAA-compliant website tracking options and related costs.

11. Adjournment

Chair Rienks adjourned the meeting at 6:32 pm.

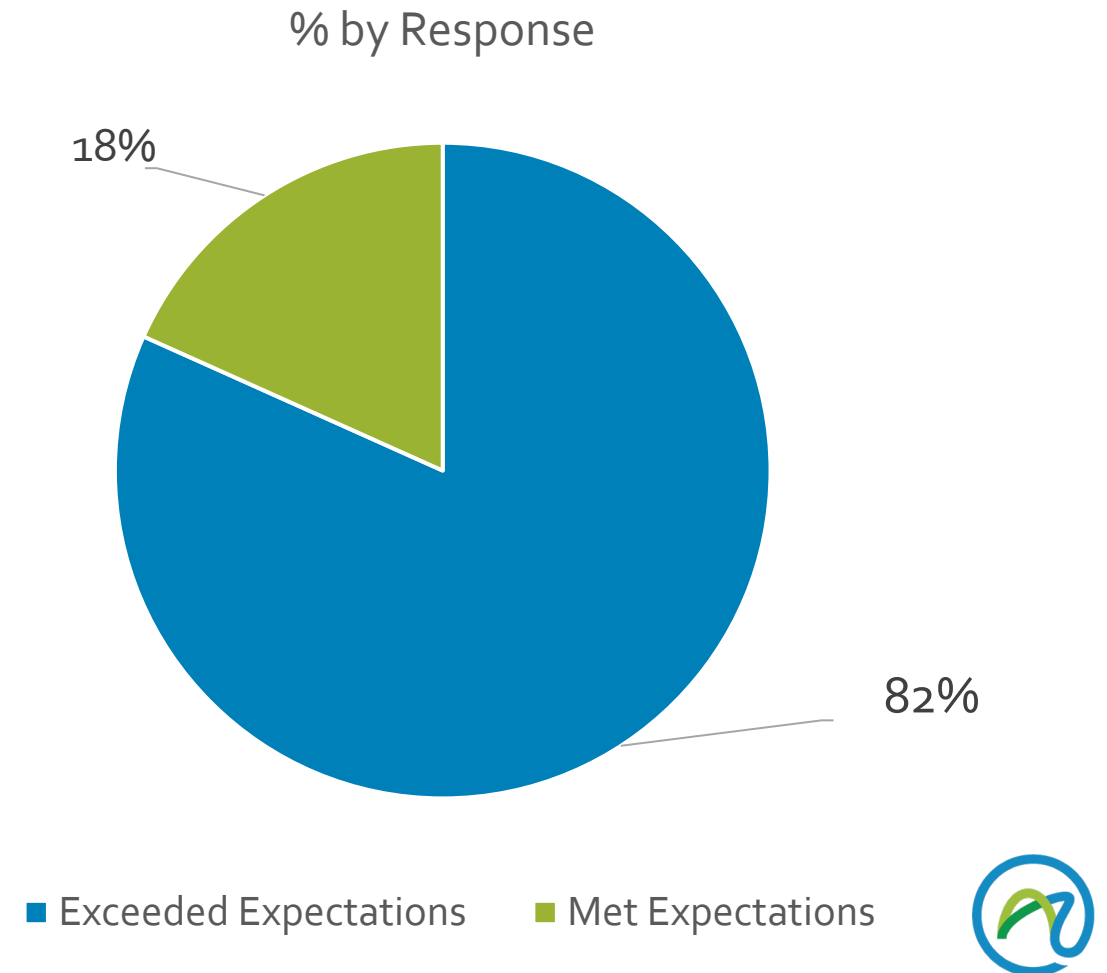

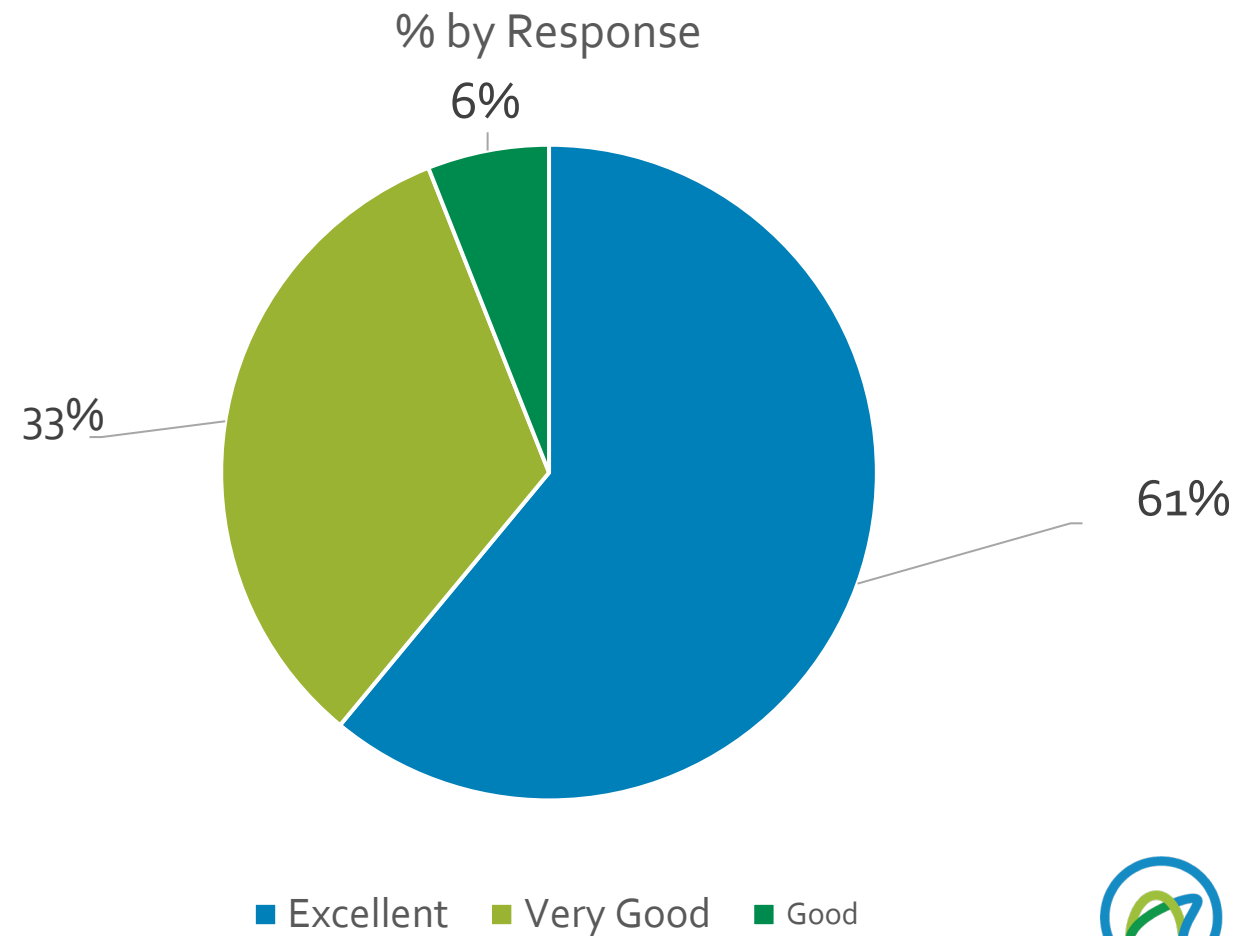

The Marin Healthcare District is a public agency created by the community to help ensure local access to high-quality healthcare. The District owns MarinHealth Medical Center and serves as the sole corporate member of the nonprofit organization that operates the hospital, helping ensure this important community resource continues to serve the needs of Marin residents.

But the District's work extends beyond the walls of the hospital. We invest in programs and partnerships that promote health and wellness throughout our community—from free health screenings and health education to programs that introduce local students to careers in medicine.

At the heart of our work is a simple commitment: **to help ensure our community has access to the care, resources and opportunities that support better health—today and for generations to come.**

In this issue, we're pleased to share some of the ways the District and MarinHealth are working together to help keep our community healthy.

Finding a Primary Care Provider Is Getting Easier

Having a trusted primary care provider is one of the most important steps you can take to protect your health. And while communities across the country continue to face a shortage of primary care providers, MarinHealth is making significant progress in expanding access locally.

Over the past two years, MarinHealth has added **26 primary care physicians and advanced practice providers (APPs)**, with additional providers expected to join through the remainder of 2026 and into 2027.

That means more opportunities for individuals and families in our community to establish care close to home.

Helping Teens Find Support When They Need It

Adolescence can be challenging, and for some teens, anxiety, depression and other mental health concerns can make everyday life feel overwhelming. When that happens, finding the right support can make an important difference.

MarinHealth's **ASPIRE** program provides structured, after-school mental health support for teens while allowing them to continue living at home and attending school.

Over eight weeks, teens work with an experienced behavioral health team to better understand their emotions, develop healthy coping skills, strengthen relationships, and build confidence and resilience. Through group therapy, skills-building and individualized support, participants gain practical tools they can continue using long after the program ends.

More Orthopedic Expertise, Close to Home

MarinHealth has continued to expand its orthopedic and sports medicine programs, adding orthopedic surgeons, physician assistants and other specialists to an already comprehensive team.

Services span the full continuum of care—from diagnosis and nonsurgical treatment to surgery, rehabilitation and recovery.

For our community, that means greater access to specialized orthopedic expertise without having to travel far from home.

MarinHealth Medical Center Earns 5 Stars for Quality

Our community has another reason to be proud of its local hospital.

MarinHealth Medical Center has earned an overall **5-star rating from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS)**—the highest rating awarded through the federal agency's hospital quality rating system.

Among the 4,609 Medicare-certified acute care hospitals evaluated by CMS, MarinHealth Medical Center ranks among the top 12% nationwide and is one of only 29 hospitals in California to receive the 5-star distinction.

The recognition reflects performance across a range of measures used by CMS to help patients and families compare hospital quality.

Specialized Care for Women in Midlife and Beyond

Women's health needs change throughout life, and the years leading up to and following menopause can bring changes that affect everything from sleep and energy to heart, bone and metabolic health.

MarinHealth's new **Women's Lifelong Health & Wellness Clinic** was created to give women specialized support during this important stage of life.

Led by **Lizellen La Follette, MD**, the clinic provides comprehensive consultations and personalized care for menopause-related symptoms and other health changes that can emerge during midlife and beyond.

"Women's health needs evolve over time, and many women are looking for more guidance and support during this stage of life," said Dr. La Follette. "Our goal is to provide thoughtful, personalized care that helps women understand what's happening in their bodies and develop a plan to stay healthy, active and vibrant."

Care is available for a wide range of needs, including menopause and hormonal health, cardiovascular and metabolic health, bone health, sexual and vaginal health, sleep, mental health, and preventive care.

When additional expertise is needed, the clinic can also coordinate care with MarinHealth specialists in cardiology, endocrinology, orthopedics, behavioral health, nutrition and other areas—helping women take a more connected approach to their long-term health.
